### A.B.A.T.E. Lawyer Referral Service

At the State BOD meeting on February 13, 2021, the board voted unanimously to start a Lawyer Referral Service. Lawyers participating in the A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas Lawyer Referral Service will pay 10% of their fees from any injury claim to A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas in turn, referral fees received by the A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas Lawyer Referral Service will be used to fund the Mission of the organization.

While the goal is to always keep two wheels down, we all have experienced other motorists not keeping a lookout for motorcycles, turning in front of us, or driving while distracted. The Referral Service will ensure that attorneys participating in the program support the Mission of A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas, are motorcycle riders who are highly experienced in representing motorcyclists in Kansas, and understand the unique legaland insurance issues surrounding motorcyclists.

All injury claims - motorcycle, car, truck, semi, dangerous product, dangerous premises, etc. - qualify for the service. Additionally, in an effort to make sure that members have adequate insurance, lawyers participating in the referral service will be available to review insurance policies and coverages on members' policies at no cost.

Under the Dome at the State Capitol. I was very proud to be part of this event. There was a good turnout, we were able to have productive meetings with several legislators, and visit with representatives of legislative leadership. We will continue building on this momentum going forward. Thank you ABATE brothers and sisters

Now I would like to talk a little ABATE of Kansas history. Jon P. recently found a booklet about how and when ABATE of Kansas was founded back in 1972 by a group of motorcyclists concerned with the methods in which the Kansas legislature was addressing the issue of motorcycle safety. At the time gas prices were going up and that was the beginning of an era that saw a tremendous increase in the number of motorcycles and inexperienced riders. This helped lead to a significant increase in motorcycle related accidents. In response the

lawmakers of Kansas passed numerous laws they thought would lower the accident rates. Of course these laws included many of what we know now as the greatest hits: daytime headlight usage, turn signals, mandatory helmet and handlebar height laws.

The motorcycle veterans in Kansas resented the encroachment upon their freedom. They believed the way to reduce the number of motorcycle related accidents was to prevent the accident from happening by improving rider education. And that's exactly what they set out to do.

That's all for now. Come back next month for more to this story.

We started the new year with our legislative agenda for ABATE of Kansas. This is the start of our new session and all bills from last year died and will need to be reintroduced.

Top of the list, Motorcycle Profiling. On January 26th SB 108 was introduced, Senators Pittman and Kloos have cosponsored our motorcycle profiling bill giving us bipartisan support. SB 108 is currently in the Judiciary Committee in hopes of a hearing soon.

Second on the list is the definition of a motorcycle - The definition of a motorcycle, as defined in Kansas statutes, needs desperately revised.

The present definition "Motorcycle" defined. "Motorcycle" means every motor vehicle, including autocycles having a seat or saddle for the use of the rider and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, but excluding an electric-assisted bicycle or a tractor.

A more appropriate definition of a motorcycle would be to exclude the words "including Autocycles" from the definition of a motorcycle.

We hope to get this introduced soon.

Third on our list is Autonomous vehicles. ABATE of Kansas is honored to be on the AV committee that Governor Kelly signed into law to lay down the infrastructure regulations for all AV in Kansas, this is a four year committee.

Last but certainly not least, Right of way, motorcyclists are dying or seriously hurt with little penalties. The fine needs to correspond with the violation. This is an ongoing piece of legislation for us and we are approaching it differently this session.

January 31st was our annual Bikers Under The Dome held at the beautiful Capitol in Topeka.

We met at 9am to talk with legislators. ABATE of Kansas along with the Kansas COC and The MRF were all in attendance to help and hand out important information.


11am our speakers stepped up to the podium. Byron Harden President of ABATE of Kansas, Jimbo Chair of KSCOC, Tony Railsback Lobbyist for ABATE and our special guest MRF Lobbyist Rocky Fox.

Then we all resumed meeting with our legislators and had meaningful talks with legislators and staffers in the rotunda.

It is now Mid-February and our 2023 legislative is in full swing. On January 24th. Senator Pittman (Dem.) and Senator Kloose (Rep.) Introduced a profiling Bill in the Senate Judiciary Committee, SB 108. This bill is very well written and it's great to have bipartisan sponsorship. We are now trying to get a hearing on this bill. I have spoken with Senator Steffens (Rep.) who sits on the Judiciary Committee. I am hoping he will move this forward to a hearing for us.

We are also working towards a bill on the definition of a motorcycle. The way the current statute is written it includes autocycles as motorcycles. Example Polaris Slingshot. The driver of a Autocycle is not required to have a M endorsement on their driver's license and passengers under the age of 18 do not have to have to wear a helmet. That means their accident data ends up in the motorcycle database which is not good for us. I have not found a legislator wanting to take this on, but have talked with several who have expressed interest.

On January 29th. We held our annual Bikers Under The Dome at the state capitol. The event was well attended by ABATE, COC, and the MRF. The MRF lobbyist from Washington D.C. was there to help rally this event on, thank you Rocky Fox. There were about 45 people from all different areas in attendance at the event. Almost all of them reached out to their personal legislators. This is a great way to inform them about ABATE and their motorcyclist concerns.

I would also like to thank Bretz Injury Law for sponsoring our legislators and their staff lunch. We provided 80 box lunches and that was not enough. We had a lot of legislators and their staff come down for lunch. It was great to see them come down for lunch, visit with us and take part in our event. Again, Thank You Bretz Injury Law for Lunch. While I am passing out Thank You's. Thank You RC for getting us the TV PSA with WIBW about our event.

On February 10th. The Republican Convention was held in Topeka at the Capitol Hotel. Myself, Tammy, Byron H. Lori H. and Sis attended this convention. I felt it was a success on our behalf. There was a lot of conversation between us and our legislators and their staff. There were legislators and staff from both the state and federal level present. Most of the conversation was about issues the motorcyclist faces.

On February 24th. The democrats will be holding their convention in Topeka at The Downtown Ramada on Friday night. Again, several of us will be attending. We again will be visiting with our Democratic legislators about our concerns. ABATE will be hosting a table with finger foods, snacks and beverages. As we move forward this legislative session, I would like to Thank Jimbo with Kansas COC. for all of his and the COC help on achieving goals, we all face the same issues. They have contributed a lot of good thought, concerns and suggestions to help everyone achieve goals to benefit all motorcyclists.



She married her soulmate Byron "Buzzy" Best in 1984. They later divorced but remained close for the rest of her life.



#### Frequently Asked Questions

### Can I wear a helmet and be a member?

Yes, ABATE strives to ensure all motorcyclists reserve the right to choose to wear a helmet or not. ABATE's stance is not Anti-Helmet, but rather Anti-Helmet Law. The factors of helmet use are too complex for a simple statistic, so ABATE believes, before government law needlessly endanger lives, that such a decision should be left to the rider, and pursue other venues of motorcycle safety--primarily education and awareness.

**Do I need to be a Harley owner?** No, ABATE is an advocate for the rights of all motorcyclists, regardless of what or where they ride.

**Do I need to own a motorcycle?** No, ABATE consists of all advocates of motorcyclists and motorcycling. The rights of which may be supported by anyone who cares, and are welcome to do so.

#### Do I have to live in Kansas?

No, ABATE of Kansas has many non-Kansas-resident members who still ride in Kansas. ABATE of Kansas does not believe the rights of motorcyclists stop at the state borderline. ABATE of Kansas works with other state and national Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs) to preserve rights wherever the road leads.

**Is ABATE a motorcycle club?** *No, ABATE of Kansas is classified as a lobbying organization.* 

Which District can I belong to? You can belong to any district you prefer. Districts are divided by county groups, except District 20 which is mostly out-of-state members, however also choose districts adjacent to their state, if preferred. You may choose any district based on where you work, live, or have social ties. The only restriction is that you can only belong to one district at a time.

#### Why did I stop getting a newsletter?

Chances are most likely you have either moved or your membership has expired. Please check with your district or the ABATE of Kansas State office. It may also be you are not listed with your local post office. Please check with them to make sure you are listed at that address.

#### Do I need my ABATE card?

Yes, keep your membership card with you when you can. At events, it's faster and more reliable than roster checking. Also, many of your stops may give discounts for ABATE members.

#### Is ABATE just about helmets?

No, ABATE monitors all bills, laws, and regs that impact motorcycling, including manufacturing, operation, environment and education.

# Do I need a permit to camp on leased area at Lake Perry?

Yes, permits are required by the Corp of Engineers which are requested and obtained from the ABATE of Kansas State office in Perry, the only exception being if you plan to camp during the Labor Day Rally event.
